Homework expectations for Term 5:

Maths - Tasks on MyMaths will be set weekly to correspond with the learning in class.

Spelling - Weekly spelling lists will continue to be set on a Friday to be tested the following Friday. (A copy of these will be shared on Class Dojo each week).

Homework Menu - Throughout the term, I would like children to complete as many tasks from the 'Homework Menu' as they would like. These tasks relate to our topics in class and give the children the opportunity to develop their learning and understanding further. A minimum of one task should be completed from this menu.

Additional tasks - To support the preparation and transition to secondary school, additional tasks will be set throughout the term. This could be a grammar task or reading comprehension task.

Choose at least one task from the menu to complete before the end of term.
You may have other creative ideas relating to our topics.

Science: Forces

- Create a word search or crossword which includes keywords from the topic.
- Discover how surfaces affect friction by moving an object across different surfaces and record your findings. Which surface is fastest and why?
- James Dyson was in the inventor of which appliance? Find out how he got his idea.
- Investigate different swimming styles used by professional swimmers. Why might some techniques be faster than others?
- Write a short story about an astronaut stepping on the moon and discovering the effects of no gravity in space.

History: World War 2

- Design and test out a parachute that would allow a member of the RAF to land safely.
- 'Make Do and Mend' - create a toy using only recycled materials.
- Draw and label a plane or tank from WW2.
- Write a message to someone using Morse code.
- Imagine you are an evacuee, write a letter home to your family.
- Write a biography on a significant individual from WW2.

Creative curriculum

- Learn a wartime song and perform it to family or friends.
- Make a model of an air raid shelter.
- Bake or cook a war time recipe.
- Have a go at different techniques used in pop up books.
