PSHE

This term we think about 'Being Me in My World'. We will consider what our own goals are for the year and understand any fears and worries about the future. We will explore the universal rights for children and understand how our actions affect other people locally and globally. The British Value we will focus on more closely this term is Democracy; we will understand how having a voice benefits the school community.

Art

This term, we will learn about colour theory by studying the colour wheel and exploring mixing tints, shades and tones. We will learn about significant landscape artworks and features of landscapes using this knowledge to create landscape paintings.

Computing

In our computing lessons, we will learn about the use of technology, how to stay safe online and discover more advanced programming skills.

<u>Music</u>

In our music lessons, we will learn new musical skills/concepts and revisit them over time with increasing depth and confidence. This term we will explore songs that make us happy.

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Maths

In our Maths lessons this term, we will be revising our knowledge of place value of numbers up to 1 million (Y5) and 10 million (Y6) and apply our understanding to new concepts.

We will also be working on our accuracy of written methods for the four operations and recognise multiples and factors.

English

Our writing this term focuses on the book Queen of the Falls. We will be exploring the story of Annie Edson Taylor and her daredevil act of going down Niagara Falls in a barrel through debates, letter writing and diary entries.

In our guided reading lessons, we will be following the stories told in 'Goodnight Stories for Rebel Girls' to develop our skills of vocabulary understanding, inference, prediction, retrieval, summarising and explain.

<u>RE</u>

Our RE this term will focus on the question: Is it better to express your beliefs in arts and architecture or in charity and generosity?

History

Our topic this term is Maafa. This topic teaches children about Africa past and present, with a particular focus on the Kingdom of Benin. It traces the development of the slave trade and explores Britain's role in the transatlantic slave trade, the causes and consequences of the European colonisation of Africa and the worldwide communities that make up the African diaspora.

Science

Our Science topic this term is 'Electricity'.

We will use symbols when representing simple circuits in a diagram; recognise how the brightness of a lamp or volume of a buzzer changes with the number and voltage of cells and apply our knowledge to design an electrical scarecrow.

PE

In PE this term, we will be working on our skills of teamwork through team games. We will also develop skills of dribbling, passing and shooting in football.

French

We will be revising and learning greetings in French; recognise colours and describe 'All About Me'
